





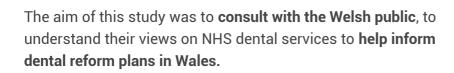
What do the Welsh public understand about NHS dental services, what do they think it could look like, and what are their priorities? A qualitative study

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Background

NHS General Dental Services in Wales are undergoing reform.





Method

Qualitative research via **interviews and focus group workshops**, undertaken between Nov 2023 and May 2024.

Key Findings



participants with **diverse backgrounds** from **all 7 Welsh Local Health Boards** took part.

6 Key Priorities were identified by our public study participants:



Easy and timely access



Good communication



Affordability



Effective care from the right person



Inclusive dental service



Education and support for self-management

Key recommendations for consideration



Improve understanding of the dental team and their roles via a public awareness campaigns and education resources



Consider tele-dentistry and alternative delivery models to offer greater inclusivity, accessibility and convenience



Improve understanding of emergency dental situations and how to access the right services



Improve education and support for better self-management of good oral health practices and preventative behaviours
